Homework expectations

Academic level - Students can expect homework 3-5 times per week. Each assignment should take a minimum of a 1/2 hour. Homework will always be used as a building block for learning the following day. If students are unprepared, they will not be successful in class.

Skills level - Students will receive homework assignments 3 times per week. Each assignment will take 1/2 hour to complete. Homework is expected to be completed so students can successfully engage in class the following day. If homework is not completed, students will have difficulty participating.

Class Participation: It is expected that students engage in their education. Students may not know the answer to every question but I expect them to put their best foot forward and give some effort. An education is something you work towards, it can not be given to someone. Therefore, I expect students to engage as much as possible with the material.

Materials: Students are expected to arrive with a pen/pencil, assignment book, and notebook if they opt not to use the one distributed to them in class. It is strongly recommended each student bring a folder to keep all handouts in a neat, orderly fashion.

Class behavior: Students need to realize our class is a learning community. No one individual student is more important than their peers. Students can learn just as much from each other as from any other source. It is important for students to volunteer their opinions and to listen to the opinions of others in a respectful manner.

Absences: Students are expected to make up all work within 72 hours of their absence. If extenuating circumstances exist, students need to approach me to work out a reasonable compromise.

Tardies: All students are expected to be in class when the bell rings. The bell signifies the start of class, not a time to settle down and get to class. Students will be expected to make up time they miss due to tardiness.
