Classroom Policies and Expectations

Notebooks: All students are required to purchase a three-ring binder for class. All of your class notes and handouts should go into the binder in the order that things are received. Your three-ring binder should be used only for History class.

Grades: All in-class assignments as well as homework assignments will be graded on a ten point scale. Most homework assignments will only count once, but lengthier and more time-consuming assignments will count as double assignments and can be factored out of 20 points.

All quizzes (always announced), projects, and reaction papers will be graded out of 100 points and will count once.

Your overall course grade will be made up of your class work/homework grades and your quiz/project/reaction paper grades all added together, and then divided by the total amount of points possible.

Absences: Don't miss class. Don't miss the experience. If you do miss class, all worksheets, handouts, and paperwork will have your name on it and be in our class folder. See me when you return. Get the notes as soon as possible from a friend or see me for the class notebook. Any work not made up before the end of the grading period will obviously receive no credit.

Make-Up Work: The grade book is available to you at any time to check for missing assignments or missing quizzes/projects. It's up to you to make sure work is completed and passed in.

Deadlines: Late assignments never receive full-credit. Two points out of ten or one letter grade is deducted for any assignment that is not in on time. Late homework and class work assignments may only be made up until the quiz on the subject being covered is taken. Once the quiz is taken, no further assignments dealing with that particular topic will be accepted.

Extra Help: I am available for extra help most days after school in room 129. Just let me know you are planning on stopping down and I'll schedule the time. Don't let confusion keep you from completing an assignment or preparing for a quiz.
